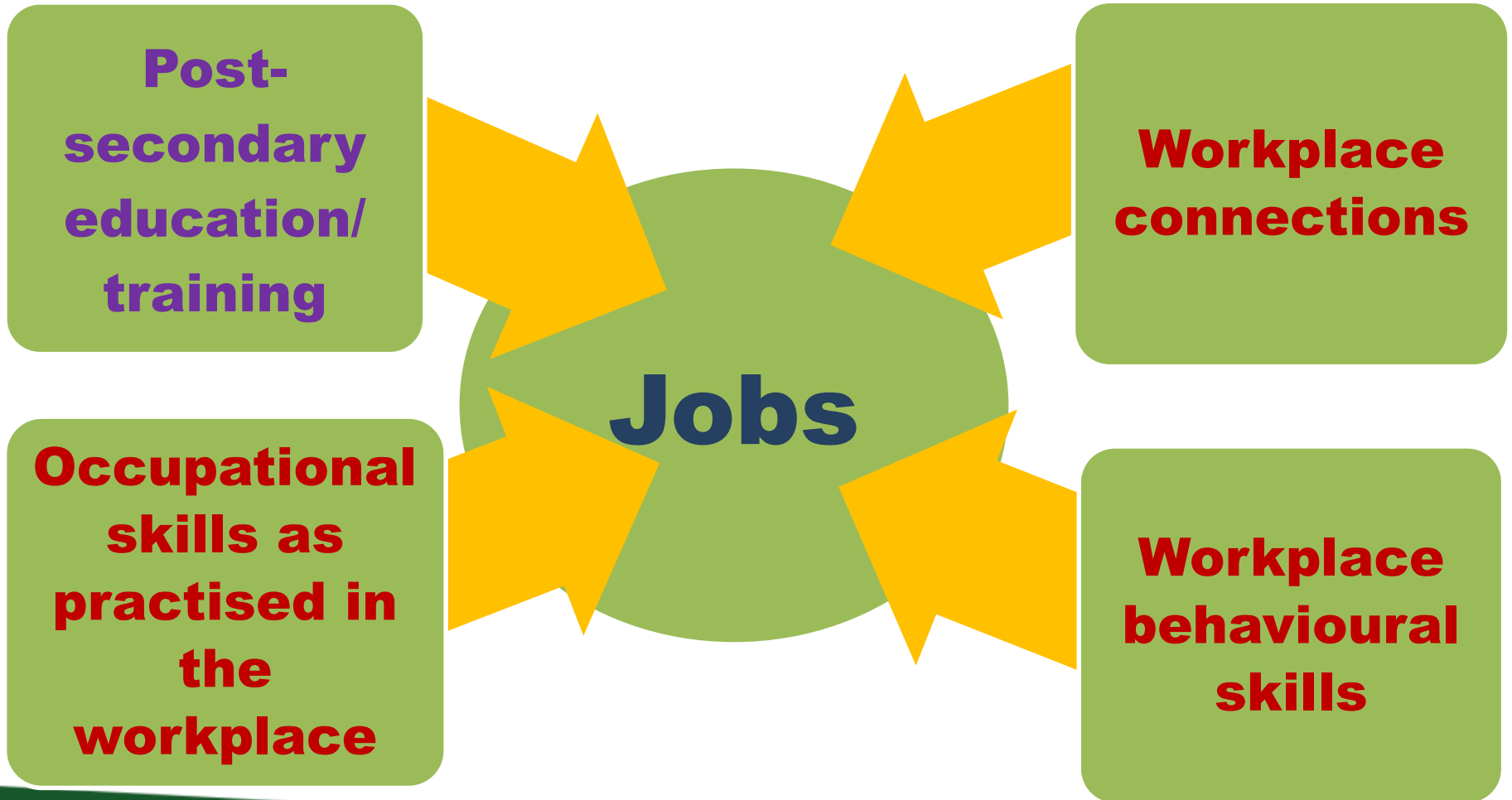

# ***TVET matters because...***

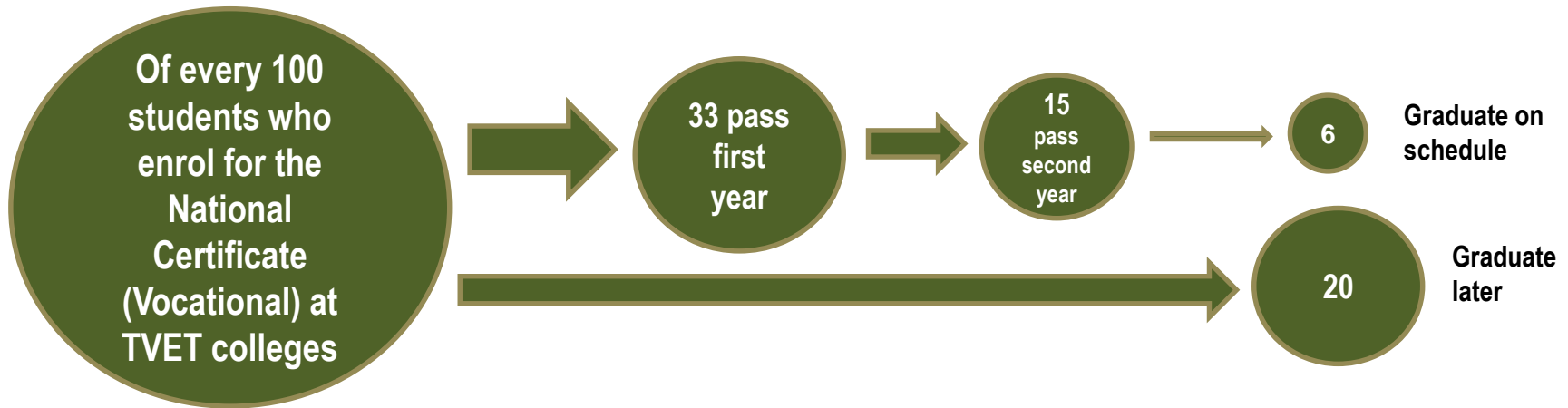

# Currently in SA:



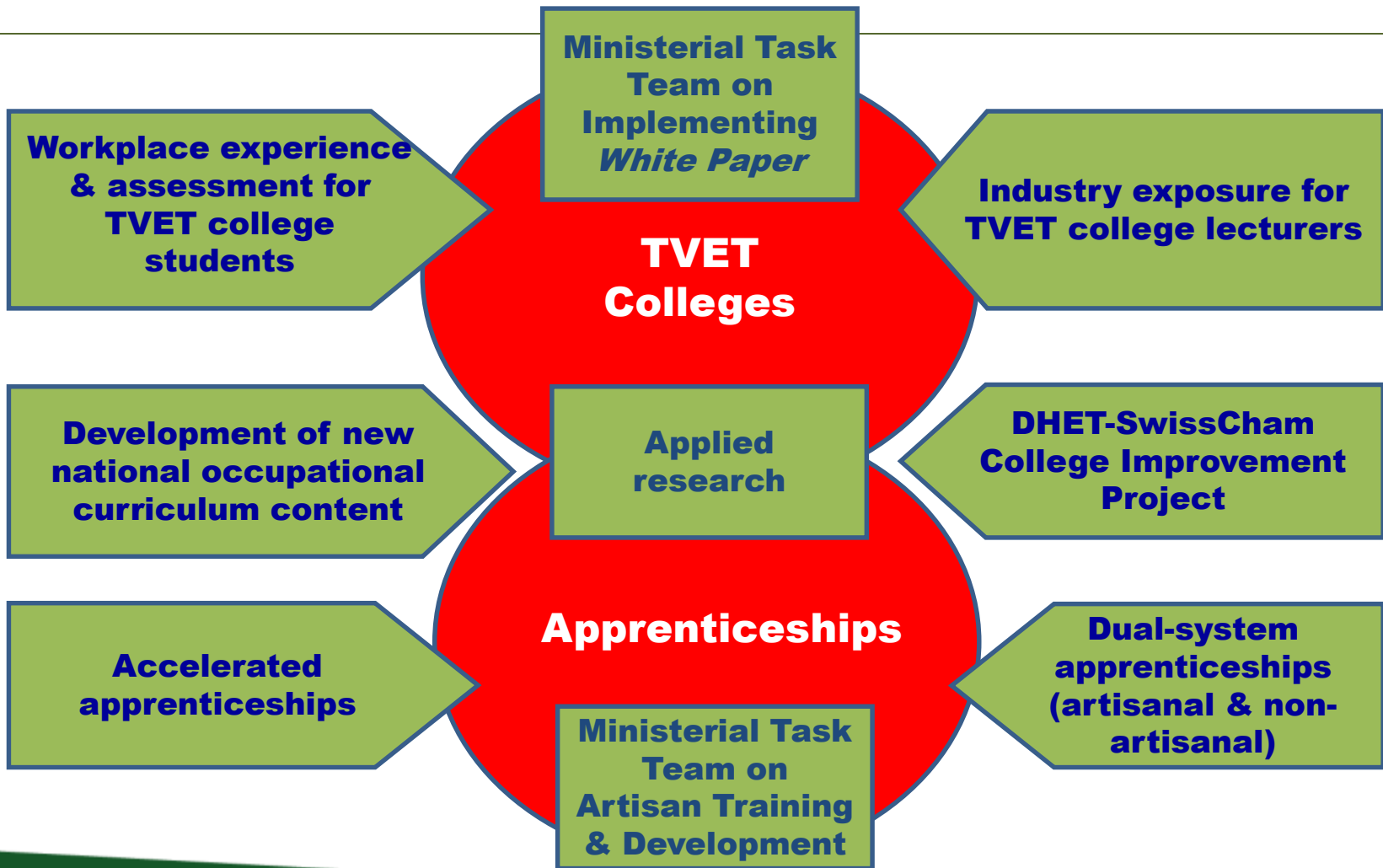
Which costs the taxpayer 44c in every Rand spent on the TVET colleges annually.

# To what effect?

- “Training programmes developed and/or implemented by SSACI **help youths to improve their livelihoods**, become more integrated into society and be more resilient to economic fluctuations.”
- “Tracer studies show that these programmes result in **high rates of wage-employment and self-employment**, and, in the case of enterprise development projects, **high numbers of new jobs created**.”
- “SSACI has successfully developed and tested **models for implementing workplace-based experience** for college students and... college lecturers, as well as **new models of artisan training**; some of these models have been institutionalized.”
- “SSACI’s work is **relevant to and consistent with national needs and priorities** and has addressed a real need in enabling public TVET colleges to engage with industry.”
- “Overall, **SSACI is influencing the national skills development system** and SSACI itself changes in response to system change.”

# ***SSACI should now...***

- **Expand its work related to workplace-based learning:** scale it up & take it into the policy arena
- **Strengthen relationships with employers & with partners**
- **Strengthen its management depth & financial base**
- **Keep it Swiss:** Maintain the Swiss identity as this helps in terms of credibility and of having a distinct offering
